Dear Parents

It's back to work in the nursery again and we have a very busy few months ahead as we look forward to the festive season. Santa's bird has already arrived in the nursery and will bring Santa all the good news about the well behaved and hardworking boys and girls in the nursery.

I hope your child's Early Days report helped to highlight your child's current strengths and areas for development. We are working at full speed every minute of every day. This month we plan to go out on an Autumn walk down to the Beechill to see and collect signs of Autumn. During the year we will have a few trips out if you think you will be available to help out please write your name on the sheet displayed on the Nursery noticeboard.

Learning in the Nursery

This month our topic is 'Space'. This topic will provide many opportunities for learning. Some of these are listed below. The children will be:

- · travelling with Buzz Lightyear 'To infinity and beyond...'
- finding out about the sun, the moon and the stars
- designing and creating rockets/control panels
- counting the points on a star and buttons on control panels
- floating and dancing in space to music
- dressing up as astronauts and travelling to the moon
- moon walking/having picnics on the moon
- collecting silver objects
- exploring magnetic objects
- listening to stories about adventures in space
- singing songs and rhymes related to the topic

As always the learning is endless and I am looking forward to where the children will take us as they explore and investigate. You can support and enhance this learning at home by showing an interest in the topic. This will help to further enrich their learning experiences and also continue to develop their language and extend their vocabulary. Please practise counting back from 10. (10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 BLAST OFF!)

Can you help us?

I would like to thank you for already providing us with lots of boxes and containers. These are a valuable resource and are used widely by the children. For our topic this month we really need empty kitchen roll holders to make telescopes, shiny or metallic materials/paper, milk carton tops, stars or tinsel

We also need other items throughout the year such as.....

- * buttons, wool, ribbon, old zips, sandpaper, foil
- *old birthday/Christmas cards/used envelopes...
- *spare pieces of fabric -nylon, netting, velvet, fake fur...
- *catalogues (the children will be browsing for Christmas presents very soon!!)
- *cooking/baking equipment stored away in cupboards that you/family members don't use anymore, e.g. small saucepans, baking trays etc.

As you can see the list is vast so we would ask you to think about us before you throw out any old/unwanted household items. All donations (child friendly) will be gratefully accepted.

Colour

This month we will focus on the colour silver to link with our 'Space' topic. If you have any silver items at home your child can bring them in for the colour display table. We will also look at the difference between grey and silver. Keep reinforcing all colours at home and extend the learning by talking about light and dark colours.

Shape

This month we will be learning about the star. We will be matching and sorting all shapes and encouraging the children to look for them in school and at home. The shops are full of stars for Christmas so this is a good learning opportunity. Encourage your child to find the stars and talk about them.

From next week Peter will go home to one special house every Thursday. He will have a digital camera with him to take some photographs of his adventures. He will arrive back to school every Monday to show the children what he got up to. Encourage your child to take some of the photographs and to talk about his adventures.

Coats and Hats

Quiet Learning

We have begun to engage the children in more settled and adult led activities. This takes place after dinner and we call this 'Quiet Learning'. This allows the children to develop concentration and to focus on co-operative group activities such as playing language and number games. These games involve learning about turn-taking, throwing and reading a number/colour/shape dice, recognising and matching pairs, listening and attending to others as well as encouraging lots of interaction with adults and peers. The adults use these opportunities to observe the children's' progress and development in a number of areas.

Learning-Puzzles

We have been working on how to complete basic puzzles by first looking carefully at the picture and discussing what the puzzle is about before we begin to assemble it. The next step is finding all the outside pieces so talking about straight edges and corners can be developed here. Finally, we will add the inside pieces and give ourselves a clap. The puzzles we use vary in the number of pieces however; the process of completing each puzzle is exactly the same. Of course there are always children who do not need a structure and can visually see what they have to do without cues. You can support this learning at home. Remember it will not work if it's not FUN too! (there are many articles online that highlight the educational value of playing with puzzles in the early years)


Music and Movement
