Can you track winter weather? I love looking at the weather each morning.

Can you check the weather outside every day for a week? How can you record what you see (draw on the whiteboard then take a picture of it)? What is the weather like in winter where you live? Is it the same every day? Is it warm or cold? Is it wet or dry? [Here is a link to a way you could set up your weather tracker.](#)

Can you throw snow balls?

Can you make snow balls from paper or crumpled foil? Can you put a bowl on the floor, stand back and throw them into the bowl? Score a point every time you land it in the bowl. Can you keep score using a tally? Can you beat your grown up's score?

Do you know the difference between HOT and COLD?




Sing along with Miss Kelly to a counting snowflake song and learn a new rhyme all about mittens.
