

### Time to talk!




Talk to your child about their feelings: who is special to them, who do they love, who would they like to send a card to, or make a Love Bug for?

Decorate your garden with our shape of the month - flour love hearts. Cut out a large heart shape in the middle of a piece of card. You could use a cereal box. Then use the card like a stencil. Hold it close to the grass, whilst another child uses a sieve and flour to create a love heart shape.





Why not try:

Make a large heart shape with sticks for the children to fill with twigs, leaves, grass etc. from the garden. Children will need to check the length, width and shape of the items to see if they will fit inside the heart.
